News Release

Sheriff Vernon Bourgeois says that on October 6, 2010, Wednesday night at approximately 10:45 p.m. Terrebonne Parish deputies responded to the 100 block of Domangue Court Chauvin in reference to a home invasion. The caller said that the suspect held the victims inside of the residence at gunpoint.

Deputies arrived at this location and learned that the suspect had fled the scene shortly before their arrival. Deputies searched the area but were unable to locate the suspect. Inside of the residence were four adults: 22 year-old w/m, 23 year-old w/f, 24 year-old w/m and a 36 year-old w/m, along with three small children.

The suspect knocked on the door and the female answered the door. The suspect then forced his way into the residence with a shotgun and a handgun demanding to know where was the brother of the 24 year-old. The brother of the 24 year-old is supposedly dating the former girlfriend of the suspect. The victims told the suspect that the person he was looking for was not there. The suspect pointed his weapons at the victims and forced them to lie down on the floor while he searched. The suspect did not locate the person he was looking for inside of the residence. He then shot the television with his shotgun and exited the residence without harming anyone. The suspect is identified as Dwayne Paul Guidry Jr., age-20, 326 Cypress Ave. Montegut.

On October 7, 2010, Thursday TPSO detectives obtained an arrest warrant for Guidry. During the morning after approximately 10:00 a.m. detectives received an anonymous call that Guidry was on Island Rd. in Montegut. Deputies and detectives responded to this call and located Guidry at his mother's residence, 326 Cypress Ave. Montegut. Guidry ran from the deputies and went into the marsh area for a short period of time before he decided to surrender. Guidry was taken into custody without incident. Guidry was transported to the Terrebonne Parish Sheriff's Office where detectives questioned him. Guidry admitted to the allegations made against him.

Dwayne Paul Guidry Jr. was arrested for home invasion. He was transported to the Terrebonne Parish Jail where he was booked and jailed. Guidry remains in jail on a \$300,000.00 bond.
